THE PROGRAM

In honor of Deborah Lambert, SWANA Evergreen Chapter President 2002-2005 and the many years she dedicated to the solid waste management field, the Washington Evergreen Chapter of the Solid Waste Association of North America (SWANA) has established a scholarship program to assist members' children and grandchildren who plan to continue their education. Scholarships are offered each year for full-time study at an accredited institution of the student's choice to qualified undergraduate and graduate students.

Awards are granted without regard to race, color, creed, religion, sexual orientation, gender, disability or national origin.

ELIGIBILITY

Applicants to the Evergreen Chapter SWANA Scholarship Program must be: Children or grandchildren of a member in good standing or be a student member in good standing.

SELECTION OF RECIPIENTS

Criteria for Award Selection

Criteria	Weighting	Example of Grading Parameters
Academics	60%	a) GPA b) ACT or SAT Scores c) Academic achievement awards
Citizenship	20%	Honors: a) Student Organization b) High School ROTC, military, etc. c) Charitable, civic, or religious organization
Extracurricular	20%	a) Athletics b) Music, drama, debate, etc. c) Employment



AWARDS

Award Categories

1 Scholarship @ \$2000

Must be accepted for enrollment in any junior college or four year college pursuing a degree in a field related to Solid Waste Management or the Environment.

1 Scholarship @ \$1000

Must be accepted for enrollment in any junior college or four year college, university, or graduate school in an degree program or major.

Awards are not renewable, but students may reapply to the program each year they meet eligibility requirements.

APPLICATION

Interested students must complete the application and mail it (received no later than May 21, 2010) along with a current complete transcript of grades to:

Grade reports and online transcripts must display student name, school name, grade and credit hours earned for each course, and term in which each course was taken.
